Playwright and Director's Note

When I first started writing of Gods and Machines, I was fresh out of Algonquin College where I learned not only playwriting but screenwriting as well. I wanted to use my unique experience to tell a story that reflected my blended education. This animated image came into my head of a girl and her poetic robot debating the usefulness of art in the apocalypse. While they sifted through a dumpster full of canvases behind an old art gallery. Being fresh out of school at the time, I was very much reflecting on my own experiences. With only six months of freedom left before my bank account would begin withering away to nothing, I felt this ticking clock towards the end of "freedom." And so, Of Gods and Machines was born. At its core it is about young people struggling to prove themselves, believing in what they are doing, but still not certain why. The play explores the societal and personal pressure to reach unrealistic goals in a short period of time. One of the key themes I have been exploring is the death of youth and the birth of responsibility. What do we do when time is up; when it's time to stop playing pretend and start playing professional? Now, of course, two and a half years later, I am no longer in the same place I was. As I am in the twilight period of my career as an emerging artist, I have answers I didn't have then. Of Gods and Machines has grown with me but remains set in the mindset of twenty-nineteen me. It's very personal to me despite its lighthearted delivery and I know personal stories are universal. We've all been young, lost, and blindly optimistic. - Kydra Ryan

For Theatre Aezir he directed Gary Kirkham's Falling: A Wake. He was the dramaturg for David Yee's play rochdale (York University/Summerworks). Adam holds a BA Honours from York Unviersity where he studied Dramaturgy. He is the recipient of The Iris Turcott Memorial Award for dramaturgy from York University.

Dan Ebbs got his theatre training at Humber College in Toronto the 1980s and was rejected by all of the professional theatres there. Thus he learned his first important lesson in theatre: humility. He considers himself an amateur actor because he does not have an Equity or an ACTRA card, but he acknowledges that the Latin root of the word amateur is 'love'. He is just happy to be on the stage and working with dedicated, creative people and, as long as he can do that, life is good.




Yunike Soedarmasto, 2nd Season


